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Where is this recorded? In the Torah in Shemot (Exodus) 29:42. Notice the worshiper is not said to be unblemished. But the worshiper, though blemished with sin, has a temurah (substitute), a khalifah (an exchange). If only our people would come back to the Hebrew Bible. Then on the morning of Erev Yom Kippur this would be their prayer: "Zeh (this [is]) khaleefatee (my Exchange), zeh (this [is]) temuratee (my Substitute), zeh (this [is]) kaparatee (my Kaporah, my expiation, my blood atonement for my sins). Zeh (this) Moshiach (Goel Redeemer Savior) yelech (goes) l'moto (to his death, Daniel 9:24-26), v'ani (and I) elech (go) l'chayvei olam (to eternal life, Daniel 12:2)."

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
